Disposal of your used Christmas Tree at Hull Park will help local nature trails!

How? The Traverse City Parks and Recreation Department will be accepting used Christmas trees from city residential customers for recycling.

The Parks Crew will chip and recycle trees as mulch for use on nature trails.



Just bring your trees to Hull Park, located behind the Traverse Area District Library, at the end of Hannah Street and follow the Christmas Tree Drop-Off signs.

Drop trees off between 8 a.m. – 5 p.m. Friday, December 25, 2009 – Sunday, January 24, 2010.

Please don't leave your Christmas trees in alleys or on streets; the city will NOT be collecting them.

- Apply for up to \$10,000 to offset the installation of new energy efficient lighting as well as non-lighting energy-efficient equipment.*

Save Energy with LED Christmas Tree Lights!

LED (Light Emitting Diode) technology:

- Uses up to 90% LESS energy than standard incandescent bulbs!
- Keeps a string of bulbs lit even when a single bulb goes out. LEDs do not have a filament inside that can burn out.
- Produces little heat and remains cool to the touch, making LEDs safer around combustible materials.
