Earth Day in Traverse City

25th Annual Seedling Giveaway Courtesy of Traverse City Light & Power Saturday, April 20 | 8 a.m. - until gone

2013 marks the 25th year Traverse City Light & Power (TCL&P) has celebrated Earth Day with a seedling giveaway. In 1988, TCL&P held its first annual seedling giveaway at the Bayside Power Plant, giving seedlings away to customers and local community groups in support of the environment. That tradition continues today.

This Earth Day, pick up a free eastern white pine (pinus strobus) seedling, courtesy of TCL&P. The seedlings will be available beginning at 8 a.m. until they are gone on Saturday, April 20, at the Sara Hardy Farmer's Market (Union Street and Grandview Parkway) in downtown Traverse City. Each seedling is potted and ready for planting.

As part of our efforts to support the community and the environment, TCL&P has given away over 140,000 seedlings to customers, community members, school children, and local organizations over the years.

A fact about the Eastern White Pine:

Eastern white pine, also called northern white pine, was adopted as the state tree of Michigan in 1955. Because it is among the more rapid growing northern forest conifers, the white pine is an excellent tree for reforestation projects, landscaping, and Christmas trees, and has the distinction of having been one of the more widely planted American trees.





Friendly Reminder:

When planting your new white pine seedling, or any other trees, remember not to plant them under or near power lines. If necessary, only plant low growth shrubs and bushes under power lines.

Did You Know...

Did you know that Earth Day was founded in 1970 as a day of education about environmental issues? Earth Day is now a globally celebrated holiday that is sometimes extended into Earth Week. The brainchild of Senator Gaylord Nelson and inspired by the antiwar protests of the late 1960s, Earth Day was originally aimed at creating a mass environmental movement. It began as a "national teach-in on the environment" and was held on April 22 to maximize the number of students that could be reached on university campuses. By raising public awareness, Nelson hoped to bring environmental causes into the national spotlight.
